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<p>Policy</p>	<p>The Board of Trustees of Seven Generations Charter School (“Charter School”) recognizes that charter schools must comply with Chapter 711 of Title 22 of the Pennsylvania Code, Charter School Services and Programs for Children with Disabilities.</p> <p>The Board of Trustees of Charter School also recognizes that charter schools are not exempt from federal special education laws or regulations included in Chapter 711. These include but are not limited to enumerated provisions of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Improvement Act (2004) (“IDEA”) and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973.</p> <p>Charter School shall ensure that all children with disabilities enrolled in the charter school, regardless of the severity of their disabilities, and who are in need of special education and related services, are identified, located, and evaluated and a practical method is developed and implemented to determine which children with disabilities are currently receiving needed special education and related services.</p> <p>Charter School must be able to document that children with disabilities, who are in need of special education programs and services, are identified and evaluated through child find activities. Child find includes public awareness activities that are sufficient to inform parents of the special education programs and services that are available and how to request those services.</p> <p>Charter School must conduct systematic screening activities that lead to the identification and evaluation of children with disabilities. Basic screening procedures might include but are not limited to hearing and vision tests as well as grade level tests of academic performance.</p> <p>Charter School must also have a system to evaluate the overall success and effectiveness of public awareness and child find activities.</p> <p>Charter School recognizes that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Children with disabilities must be admitted on the same basis as children without disabilities. • Upon admitting a child with a disability, the school must provide services to address the child’s specific needs. • When a student with a disability transfers to the school, the school is responsible for ensuring that the student receives services that are described in an Individualized Education Program (IEP), either by adopting the old IEP or by developing a new IEP.
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<p>Delegation of Responsibility</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Charter School will use the most current and appropriate versions of Special Education Formats. • To meet the requirements of federal law, Charter School may provide the services itself, or contract with another entity, such as an intermediate unit or school district, to provide the services, respecting the least restrictive environment requirements. <p>The Board of Trustees of Seven Generations Charter School authorizes the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) or his/her designee to enforce this policy</p>
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
